CHARDONNAY

I know many people gravitate toward California for Chardonnay, but why not try one from the grape's true home? If you like bright, crisp styles with more mineral and less oak, try a Chablis or anything from Oregon. If you're into bigger styles with more weight and oak presence, try something from Meursault or Montrachet.

PINOT NOIR & GAMAY

California makes wonderful Pinots, but why not try a version of it from the grape's birthplace? For light, delicate, floral, go Savigny or Chambolle. For round, silky, dark: go Volnay, Pommard, or Nuits-St-Georges. Oregon Pinots bridge the gap between Old World and New World styles. They have fruit and body but also have restraint, acidity, and terroir.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON

"Cab and a slab" is the old saying. Fat content plays a key role when choosing a cabernet to pair with dinner. The more fat in the dish the more tannin you want in the wine aka you might want a massive almost chewy wine. A Barolo from the Piedmont in Italy is an outstanding alternative.

BORDEAUX & PROPRIETARY BLENDS

The term “Bordeaux” or “Bordeaux Style” are typically used to refer to a wine from a particular region and not directly to grapes, but it implies something about the grapes used to make the wine. In the Bordeaux region of France, red wines are blended from the Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petite Verdot grapes.

SYRAH, SHIRAZ & RHONE BLENDS

Looking for a full-bodied wine with dark fruit mixed with pepper and smoke? Try something from this section. For a more lush, dark fruit, go Shiraz. For earth, pepper, and terroir, try a French Syrah. For more concentrated fruit with a backbone of jerky spice, try something from California or Washington. Wines from the Rhone Valley and many other areas in France are almost always blends whose predominant players are usually Grenache, Syrah, and Mourvedre, to name just a few. They span the gamut of medium- to full-bodied and fruit-driven to massive, earthy, and dry, but they all have one thing in common: solid structure, dark fruit, and pepper.
